TAYLOR-ZENT HOUSE - 715 N. Jefferson Street -- An exuberant composition of tile, towers, gables, terra cotta and round arches springing from stately columns make this home one of the best examples of Romanesque Revival architecture to be found anywhere. It was built in 1896-98 for Enos T. Taylor, a self-made businessman and banker, who rose from humble beginnings to financial and social prominence. This building, a symbol of his enterprise, was designed by the Chicago architect, T. J. Long and constructed by the local builder, D. D. Whitelock.
